

Children Belong Here

There is a place for families and children of all ages here! We believe children who worship with their church family stick with their faith for a lifetime. Choose what works best for your family:

- The Prayground in the back of the sanctuary, where children may do quiet activities, with you nearby to assist, as they absorb the worship service.
- The Backyard Playroom is a free program offering a safe, indoor environment for children ages five (5) and under to play under parental/guardian supervision, and is open Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9am to 12pm.
- Sunday School: Following the Time with Children, kids may go with Sunday school leaders to class, which ends at the conclusion of the worship service.
- Nursery: Childcare for infants and toddlers during the 10:30am service, with background-checked staff and volunteers.

Finding Your Way

Kirkman Fellowship Hall: Use either staircase in the lobby to go downstairs into the Hall. Nursery: Located to the right of the lobby, down the hallway across from the Sunflowers Preschool classroom. Elevator: Down the hall, left past the Sunflowers Preschool classroom. Restrooms: Women's & Men's are at the top of the short stairwells in the lobby; All Gender/Single in the narthex outside the sanctuary; Accessible is at the end of the hallway near the Fireside Room. Hearing-assist devices: Ushers near the sanctuary doors are available to assist you.





Communion of the People

Everyone is welcome to receive communion! You are welcome at God's table here regardless of your denomination or affiliation. Communion is offered by intinction. You are invited to come forward by the center aisle to the servers at the front of the church. Please open your hands and the server will place the bread into them. Gently dip your bread into the cup of juice, then eat it all together. Return to your seat by the side aisles.

A gluten free station is in front of the lectern on the right side of the sanctuary for any who prefer to use it. At this station, individual cups of juice are available instead of the dipping option. Take a cup and drink from it, then place the cup in the trashcan nearby.

If you prefer to be served in the pew, please remain there and a server will come to you.

Prayer After Communion

Chancel Choir Presentation of "Christmas Oratorio" by Camille Saint-Saëns

On **Sunday, December 15**, the Chancel Choir will sing in worship the beautiful "Christmas Oratorio" by Camille Saint-Saëns (1835-1921). Saint-Saëns, just 23 at the time, composed the work in under two weeks in 1858 for the church of La Madeleine in Paris where he was the organist. It is scored for five soloists, mixed chorus, organ, harp, and strings. The narrative portion of the text, taken from the second chapter of Luke, appears in the second movement and tells the part of the traditional Christmas story involving the shepherds. The remainder of the texts, taken from John, Isaiah, Lamentations, and the Psalms, reflect upon the meaning and significance of the event.
