Children Belong Here

There is a place for families and children of all ages here! We believe children who worship with their church family stick with their faith for a lifetime. Choose what works best for your family:

- The Prayground in the back of the sanctuary, where children may do quiet activities, with you nearby
 to assist, as they absorb the worship service. Third graders and older are encouraged to sit with their
 family in the pews.
- The Backyard Playroom is a free program offering a safe, indoor environment for children ages five
 (5) and under to play under parental/guardian supervision, and is open Monday, Wednesday, and
 Friday from 9am to 12pm.
- Sunday School: Following the Time with Children, kids may go with Sunday school leaders to class, which ends at the conclusion of the worship service.
- Nursery: Childcare for infants and toddlers during the 10:30am service, with background-checked staff and volunteers.

Finding Your Way

Kirkman Fellowship Hall: Use either staircase in the lobby to go downstairs into the Hall. Nursery: Located to the right of the lobby, down the hallway across from the Sunflowers Preschool classroom. Elevator: Down the hall, left past the Sunflowers Preschool classroom. Restrooms: Women's & Men's are at the top of the short stairwells in the lobby; All Gender/Single in the narthex outside the sanctuary; Accessible is at the end of the hallway near the Fireside Room. Hearing-assist devices: Ushers near the sanctuary doors are available to assist you.

(Please note: the parking and building entrance are at the rear of the building.) This local organization, run by fellow Presbyterians, is a 501(C)(3) utilizing an all-volunteer staff and workforce. At no cost to families, Building Beds 4 Kids provide beds to kids who have no bed to sleep in—often in situations of fleeing domestic violence, foster care, or other family transitions. Over the last two years, two FPCRO congregation members have been serving here weekly, sanding bed frames for assembly by other volunteers. We expect the tour to last until around 1pm. Session recently approved a financial gift to BB4K from our Mission budget. We hope you can join us!
